## QUARTERLY HIGHLIGHTS: GROWTH, RESILIENCE & COLLABORATION

### 1. FOOD FOREST HARVEST & RECOVERY



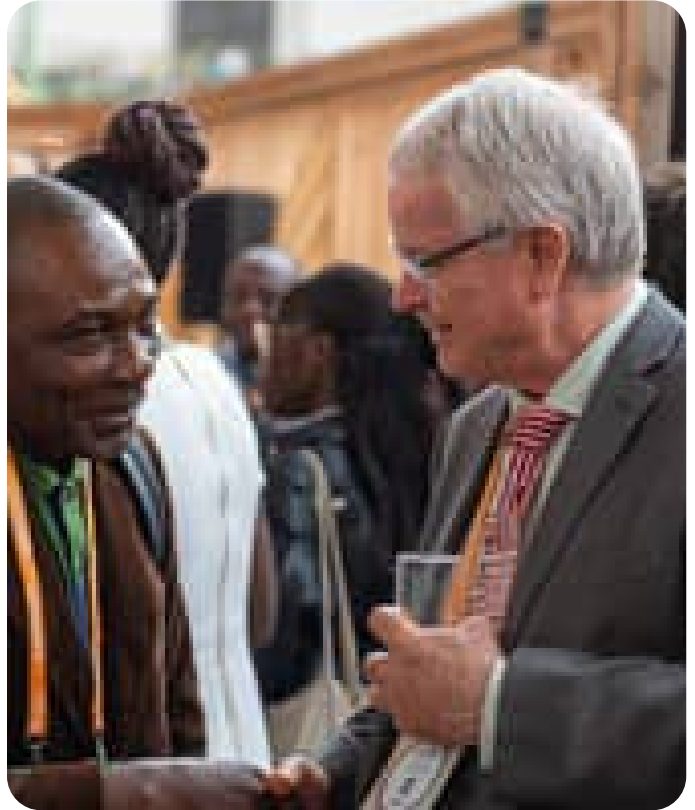
This quarter, our Wandusoa Food Forest yielded a bountiful harvest, covering 30% of operational costs before a severe windstorm in early June damaged key crops, particularly plantains. Thanks to the swift support of **Kanthari Foundation Switzerland**, emergency replanting efforts are underway to restore the forest's productivity. Their partnership exemplifies the power of global solidarity in regenerative resilience.

👉 Lesson: Climate challenges remind us to diversify and fortify our systems.

In April, Wandusoa stood among the world's top solutions at ChangeNow in Grand Palais, Paris, showcasing our model for regenerative agroforestry and community-led restoration. Being selected as a "Solution for the Planet" amplified our voice and connected us with innovators who are committed to creating scalable impact.

## STRATEGIC VISITS & COLLABORATIONS

Our Simbock Yaoundé office hosted pivotal leaders this quarter:

- Atim Mbah (Green FarmLands Cameroon) : Partnered to launch Black Soldier Fly hubs , training smallholder farmers (especially women) to produce organic fertilizers/ pesticides from waste—closing the loop on circular agriculture.
- Audrey Michaud & Jeannot Essi (Green Sanctuaries) : Discussed training programs for Indigenous communities near protected forests, ensuring livelihoods align with regenerative practices to reduce deforestation pressure.
